Writing:

This week I want the pupils to complete the following writing activity:

Last week I asked you to write an informal letter to someone you know. This week we will write to someone famous. We do this every year and get some great responses but there are some things to bear in mind when choosing who to write to:

- 1. You are more inclined to get a reply from someone from or living in Ireland.
- 2. Be sure to explain why you are writing to them, that it's part of a school activity.
- 3. Ask them some questions; tell them why you chose to write to them etc; tell them about yourself.
- 4. Have you a nice / funny story that relates to them? One year a girl wrote to Classic Hits FM asking for a shout-out to the class and told them all about our 'Music Moments' which was great fun for everyone.
- 5. See if you can locate their address online or ask somebody older at home but if you are struggling just let me know and I'll give you a hand getting it ok.
- 6. The letter needs to be at least 1.5 A4 pages. No less please
- 7. This letter will take more than one attempt. Expect to have to make corrections, edit the text and rewrite it again.
- 8. Once again, do not forget to use punctuation, correct spelling and the proper layout of a formal letter as per the link below.
